<u>Merit Badges offered:</u> In the morning choose from Art, Citizenship in the Nation, Communication, Cooking, and Photography.

In the afternoon choose from Citizenship in Society, Emergency Preparedness, Reptile & Amphibian Study, and Stamp Collecting.

Merit Badge Prerequisites and Homework

Art: May require time during lunch to complete your art projects.

Citizenship in the Nation: Req 7 may require homework

Citizenship in Society: We should finish it all.

Communication: Do before:

Reg 1a, log a day of your communication.

Req 2a, make a creative way to describe yourself, like a poster board or diorama, to present.

Req 3, research a personal topic of interest so you'll have knowledge enough to do a presentation on it.

Req 6, find a Merit Badge or Rank requirement you are confident in teaching to another Scout.

Reg 9, report on 3 careers in communication

Take home:

Req 4, interview someone you know fairly well

Req 5, attend and report back on a public meeting

Req 6, teach the skill you prepared

Cooking: The cooking requirements (4, 5, & 6) can't be done there.

Do after Reqs 8b, emergency kits,

Photography: May require time during lunch to complete your photo projects. Bring a digital camera and preferably a laptop or tablet to edit.

Reptile & Amphibian Study: Homework, req #8, keep or watch a reptile.

Stamp Collecting: Homework or bring with you, req. #8, stamp collection.
